




Incarcerated Students FTES







Enrollment Management Plan/Strategy

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- Goal: To get back to our hold-harmless enrollment levels of 2019-2020 by year-ending 2023-24.
 - By end of year 2022-23: increase enrollment by 20%
 - By end of year 2023-24: increase enrollment by 10%

- Increase dual enrollment by 30%
- Increase enrollment in our restorative justice programs by 50%
- Provide educational opportunities to local communities in Calexico and/or in Brawley
- Increase the full-time enrollment from 45% to 49%
- Develop partnerships that expand access to populations that are not adequately being served by IVC
- Increase F2F and/or online asynchronous instruction to a minimum of 65%
- Improve student persistence to 79% semester to semester and 65% Fall to Fall





STUDENTS ERVICES AND EQUITY STUDENT HOUSING UPDATE





Since August 2021, (3) students have successfully transitioned out of the Lotus Living Community tolong term permanent housing. One of the students that transitioned shared the following:

"It's been years since I've felt like there's some sort of comfort, security and just stability, Life has been really hard."

The Housing Team continues to collaborate with programs on and off campus to provide resources for students. At the same time the team continues to provide check-ins and academic monitoring.


100% of students that are currently housed have completed counseling student educational plans (CSEPs)

The team has received 331 requests for student housing since January 2021.

We continue to link students to available housing resources outside of the tiny homes such as rental assistance and emergency hotel vouchers.







The Contact CenterTeam has directly outreached to over 15,000 current/former students and community members interested in enrolling at IVC. Since August 2021, the team has sent out over 60,000 total texts, emails and phone calls to students and interested community members.

The team has attended over 25 outreach and community events. Some recent events they conducted outreach included the Imperial Valley Continuum of Care Point in Time Count, the Holtville Carrot Festival and the IV Fair & Fiesta Festival.

The SEA counseling team also dedicates countless hours at our county high schools assisting seniors with abbreviated educational plans.
ESL SERVICES	In collaboration with the ESL Faculty Department and SEA, there is new email students can use to inquire about ESL courses and services: ESL@IMPERIAL.EDU	 The SEATeam welcomed a new Language Success and Equity Counselor, Suellen Gonzalez, to work closely with ESL students and support their educational goals.
BASIC NEEDS	We are integrating our Basic Needs Center to connect students across all BN services at IVC. In collaboration with other departments, we are branding together as IVCCARES	 Since August 2021 and in collaboration with IV Food Bank and SDSU Brightside Produce. We have served over 1,620 families (translates to roughly 7,000 people). The team also continues to assist students through CalFresh application assistance, daily grab n' go packs, dinner program, hygiene items, book lending library, and tech lending library of laptops/MiFitowers.

A ₂ MEND	The A2Mend program has been established as a Club Charter.	 AzMend program is looking to expand services to integrate a mentorship program for African American students at IVC.
RESTORATIVE JUSTICE PROGRAM	The program continues to serve students that are justice-impacted through current or former incarceration.	 The CCC system has recently opened up a grant opportunity to expand services for justice-impacted students. The Team has also welcomed a new project specialist, Jennifer Jaime, to support program efforts at IVC, Centinela/Calipatria Prisons, and Imperial County Jails.

The team hosted a successful Veteran's Day Celebration that was attended by over 75 people from IVC and our IV community. They are currently working on expanding outreach efforts for MVSC students.
RESILIENT SCHOLARS	Team continues to provide services for students from foster care and homeless communities.	 In collaboration with IVROP ACE and ICOE - FYSP the team continues to outreach to students who have experience within the foster care system. Currently serving 110 students.






