1. RDA Backfill: The governor has signed a budget cleanup bill that allocated up to \$100 million in additional backfill prior to the end of the year. This is not an ideal solution because it continues the uncertainty of revenue until mid-year. But it again underscores how challenging managing our budgets with so much uncertainty has become. Of the \$100 million, IVC is hoping to receive \$1 million if we receive 100 percent of what the state owes us.

#### 2. IRS Notices: In recent weeks, due to stiffening in enforcement procedures, community colleges around the country have received notices from the Internal Revenue Service about 1098-T returns with missing or inaccurate student taxpayer identification numbers. The 1098-T is the form colleges are required to provide all students who may be eligible to claim the Hope Scholarship or Lifetime Learning tax credits. Of the 3,300 1098-T returns filed by IVC, there are 100 with missing or incorrect information. We are working with the IRS to resolve those issues.

#### STATE UPDATE

3. Overhaul of Adult Education: The 2013-14 State Budget tasked chancellor's office with implementing an ambitious reform of Adult Education, including the distribution of \$25 million in planning grants. They will be awarded through a statewide RFA process to local consortia made up of at least one community college district and one K-12 adult education provider. Additional consortia partners may include libraries, community based organizations, jails, and other adult education providers. The RFA is expected in December.

### **COMMUNITY COLLEGE BACCALAUREATE?**

After several meetings, the statewide Baccalaureate Degree Study Group is completing its process, with findings and recommendations slated for release at the Community College League of California conference in November. Other groups will also be discussing this at their statewide meetings.

We will need everyone's support after that in helping both educators and the public understand that this is an effort to provide a few, selected degree programs for workforce preparation in high-demand fields which the public universities either lack altogether (e.g., automotive) or lack capacity to meet demand (e.g., Nursing).



This is a practical effort, not one that is designed to turn community colleges into four-year institutions. It is an option that is designed to complement the fundamental community college mission, not supplant it.
