STATE UPDATE - MAY REVISE

The revised budget makes technical adjustments for property tax (+17.7m general fund) and student fee revenues (+24.7m general fund), and continues the plan to pay off all remaining apportionment deferrals. Student fees would remain at \$46 per credit unit.

The summary also proposes to increase the enhanced noncredit funding rate to the credit rate beginning in 2015-16, a significant win for our advocacy.

JOINT HIGHER EDUCATION ADVOCACY DAY

Bill Gay joined a team from SDICCCA on April 29 for the statewide Joint Higher Education Advocacy Day in Sacramento. His team was led by Grossmont Cuyamaca Chancellor Cindy Miles and included PIOs from SDICCCA colleges as well as representatives from CSU San Marcos and UCSD. They met with key Assembly and Senate

staff members as well as Assemblyman Rocky Chavez during the daylong event. Topics discussed included linkages between the Community Colleges, CSU and UC. Our IVUP program was held out as one of the examples. In all, there were 16 higher education advocacy teams trooping through the capitol that day.

BILLS BEING WATCHED

- **SB 965:** Financial stabilization for City College of San Francisco was passed out of Senate Education, but was amended to reduce the duration of additional stabilization from four years to three, and additional reporting requirements were included. Similar bills in both houses (SB 1068 and AB 1942) that could involve the Board of Governors in accreditation have been passed out of their respective education committees, but more changes in those bills are expected.
- **AB 1451:** The Board of Governors sponsored bill on dual/concurrent enrollment was passed out of the Assembly Education Committee unanimously with amendments that would ensure that no courses we taught on high school campuses would incentivize the high schools to use our courses as a way to cut their own curriculum.
- **SB 850:** The bill that would authorize our colleges to pilot offering the Bachelor's degree was passed out of the Senate Education Committee on a unanimous vote with some additional amendments that would narrow the pilots to 15 colleges in 15 districts, and prohibit any duplication with other public colleges in the state.

ASSOCIATE DEGREES FOR TRANSFER SUMMARY

The system is now at 77 percent of the statewide goal, with nearly 1,250 new degrees. IVC is at 93 percent, with 14 new ADTs to be offered this fall and one more in development.

STATE FACILITIES BOND

Although we continue to hear that the Governor is opposed to a statewide education facilities bond, there is currently legislation (AB 2235 - Buchanan) pending that would put one on the November ballot, and there are reports of increasing support in the Legislature.

NEW CHIEF INSTRUCTIONAL OFFICER

On May 21, 2014 the Board approved a resolution to accept the appointment of Dr. Nicholas Akinkuoye (Dr. Nick). He will join the staff as Chief Instructional Officer. He will replace Kathy Berry who will retire June 30 2014, after 30 plus years of outstanding service to the District, having served as a faculty member, Director and Associate Dean of Nursing and the last 7 years as CIO.

A Welcome Reception will be held on June 9, 2014 at 11:00 a.m. in the Building 10 Lobby.

UCSD CHANCELLOR'S VISIT

- UC San Diego Chancellor Dr. Khosla visited the Imperial Valley and IVC to award scholarships to our IVC students on May 21st.
- Six (6) students received recognition at a pre-ceremony for their scholarships.
- Community event was held in the 2700 building to congratulate all the transfer students accepted from IVC.
