## MEMORIAL BENCH AND HONORS BRICKS

A ceremony will take place on Friday, February 7th at 5:00 pm in front of the IVC Juanita Salazar-Lowe Art Gallery for the unveiling of our first memorial bench honoring Dora Nuffer, a pioneer, teacher, and artist.

We will also unveil the honors pathway bricks which may be purchased by individuals or families in support of the IVC Foundation.

Following the ceremony which should be about 30 minutes, the art gallery will be opened as we start the newest show – The Alonzo Elias Collection.

## STATE UPDATE

- 1. Court Ruling in City College Accreditation Suit:** San Francisco Superior Court has granted a preliminary injunction filed by the San Francisco City Attorney against the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) in the City College of San Francisco (CCSF) case. The ruling will prohibit ACCJC from terminating the accreditation of CCSF until the case is tried.
- 2. State of the System Report:** The State of the System Report will be posted on the Chancellor's office website and printed in a bound format for distribution. This is the first time the legislatively-required report has been produced in a format that can be used for more than just fulfilling a statutory requirement. It will be useful in local communities to help people understand the magnitude of our system and the good work we do.
- 3. Adult Education and AB 86:** We have received the Chancellor's Office notification announcement of the release of the AB 86 Adult Education Regional Consortium Program Certification of Eligibility materials. The Certification of Eligibility provides funding to 72 regional consortia for planning work that will extend through June of 2015.
- 4. Bachelor's Degree Study Group Report:** The Chancellor has received numerous letters from many of us in support of our colleges receiving authorization to offer a Bachelor's degree in certain subjects. He has not committed to a position, yet, but intends to discuss the system's mission with the Board of Governors at their retreat in March and to meet with the members of the Legislature who are currently developing legislation regarding the community college baccalaureate.
- 5. University of California Overtures:** Late last month the Chancellor met with University of California President Janet Napolitano and her staff to begin discussions on enhancing the relationship of our two systems on transfer, as well as a number of other issues.
