State Update: CC Legislation Signed



- **AB 1741 (Rodriguez) California College Promise Grant Program:** creates a competitive grant-based program to fund campus partnerships similar to the Long Beach Promise.
- **AB 526 (Holden) Attendance at Community Colleges:** Eliminates the 5 percent cap on summer school enrollment in dual or concurrent enrollment programs.
- **AB 2364 (Holden) Exemptions from nonresident tuition:** Reduces policy barriers that prevent AB 540 students from accessing dual enrollment programs.
- **AB 2654 (Bonilla) Equity in Higher Education AAB 1690/SB 1379 (Medina/Mendoza) Community colleges: part-time, temporary employees:** Combined, both bills: State the intent of the legislature that all districts should implement some type of policy regarding re-employment rights. Mandate that districts negotiate in good faith on whether or not part-time faculty members should have re-employment rights. Tie this process to receiving Student Success and Support Services (SSSP) funds.
- **AB 2654 (Bonilla) Equity in Higher Education Act (Sexual Harassment Policies):** Requires a community college district to post its policy on sexual harassment on its website and requires the policy to include specific rules and procedures for pursuing available remedies and resources.
- **AB 2738 (Olsen) Local School Bonds: Investment:** Prohibits the proceeds from the sale of bonds from being withdrawn by the school district or community college district for investment outside the county treasury.
- **SB 1359 (Block) Public Postsecondary Education: Course Materials:** Will require each campus of the California Community Colleges to identify in each published schedule of classes whether a course uses free or low cost open educational resources (OER).
- **SB 1314 (Block) Middle Class Scholarship Program:** Community College Baccalaureate Degree Program: Specifies that community college students participating in the baccalaureate degree programs who also satisfy the eligibility requirements for a Cal Grant award and Middle Class College Scholarship award shall receive an award.
- **AB 801 (Bloom) Success for Homeless Youth in Higher Education Act:** Establishes priority enrollment for homeless students and makes them eligible for a Board of Governors Fee Waiver.
- **SB 906 (Beall) Public Postsecondary Education: Priority Enrollment:** Revises the definition of foster youth and extends priority enrollment indefinitely to students who are in EOPS programs and to disabled students.

State Update: Legislation (Continued)



- **AB 1747 (Weber) Food Assistance:** Higher Education Students: Requires a college that is located in a county that has a Restaurant Meals Program to apply to become an approved food vendor or to provide contracting food vendors with information about the program.
- **AB 1995 (Williams) Homeless Students:** Access to Shower Facilities: Will require a college to create a plan to open their shower facilities a minimum of two hours a day for five days a week to all enrolled students.
- **AB 2791 (Medina) Community Colleges:** Disability Services Program: Authorizes colleges to receive Disabled Student Programs and Services (DSPS) funds for a student that is enrolled in DSPS but not yet enrolled in a class.

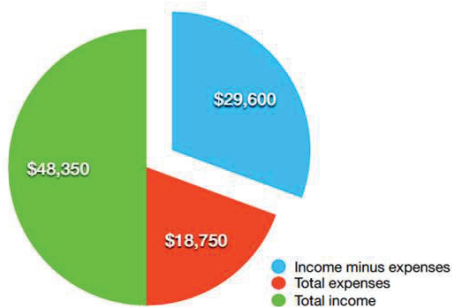
