
- Cash for college


#### **SPRING 2016 STUDENT ENROLLMENT COMPARISON**

## STATE UPDATE

#### System Report for 2015

The Chancellor has released the 2015 State of the System report which details some of our results in restoring access, improving student success and enhancing our role in workforce and economic development.

#### <u>State Budget</u>

Governor Brown's January budget proposal is the first of the long-running budget process leading to the May revise and final adoption by the end of the fiscal year. The governor's recommended investment in the restoration of access and in our workforce initiative, as well as his proposals for basic skills and improvement of the Cal Grant program are all very important to the future of our colleges and their ability to serve our students.

- We endorse the intent of SB 66


(Levya) to renew the career pathways Program.
