

STATE UPDATE

- New Skills Builder Metric: A new Student Success tool called Skills Builder will be included in the March 30 Scorecard. For the first time, the success of those who were previously identified non-completers in Career Technical Education courses will be measured. Until now, traditional accountability systems that measure only degrees, certificates and transfer were missing thousands of our success stories. These include students who work in a CTE field and received compensation advancement by completing one or two CTE courses.
- New BOG Member: All 17 seats on the Board of Governors are now filled after Governor Brown appointed Pamela Haynes, a long serving local Trustee on the Los Rios Community College in Sacramento, to the last remaining vacancy.



STATE UPDATE:

- Cal Grants Legislation: Assembly member Jose Medina has introduced AB 1892 that will reform Cal Grants for community college students enrolled in a CTE program. It would increase the access grant to \$3,000 and permit it to be used for all living expenses. Currently CTE community college students are only eligible for a Cal Grant C Access grant of \$548, while students at for-profit private schools are eligible for up to \$2,462 for tuition and fees.
- BOG Fee Waiver Academic Eligibility Requirements: To implement the Student Success Act of 2012, the Board of Governors approved regulations in January 2014, establishing academic eligibility requirements for the BOG Fee Waiver. The regulations required that the institutions begin notifying students at risk of losing the fee waiver after spring 2015 and require that the first loss of the fee waiver occur for fall 2016. Since we have a large population of BOG students, we are currently identifying those who may lose their eligibility and may therefore discontinue classes. There are certain waiver provisions and those that may be affected are being contacted by the Counseling Department to provide remediation and application fee waivers.
