

dent access and success by providing effective core services, including orientation, assessment and placement, counseling, academic advising, and early intervention.







#### **STATE UPDATE**

 BOG Report: A Chancellor's office research brief comparing California's Board of Governors Fee Waiver program to financial aid programs in other states has found that California is the most comprehensive and generous of any in the nation.

■ Accreditation: At the March Board of Governors meeting, representatives of the CEO Board including Chancellor Cindy Miles, Grossmont-Cuyamaca CCD testified about their plans to forge a better model of accreditation for our system's colleges. Two workgroups were formed – 1) to help the Commission improve their communication with their member institutions, and 2) to develop a process to move to Senior WASC.



## MAY REVISE HIGHLIGHTS

- A \$75 million increase is proposed for a base increase.
- A \$38.6 million increase is proposed to cover lower than initially estimated 2015-16 property taxes.
- A \$29.3 million decrease is proposed to reflect a 0% COLA.
- May Revision maintains enrollment growth funding of 2%.
- A \$29.2 million increase to retire prior mandate claims, which brings the new total to \$108.5 million. Language encourages these funds to be used to promote campus security, technology, and professional development.
- A \$70.1 million decrease for the Deferred Maintenance and Instructional Equipment program to help support other priorities contained in the May Revision.
- A \$4.1 million increase for Proposition 39 energy efficiency projects
- A \$3 million increase for a new program to support digital content on e-readers in state correctional facilities
- A \$5 million increase for statewide activities necessary to support the Adult Education Block Grant program.
- A \$20 million increase for the Online Education Initiative to support the development of courses in the Online Course Exchange.
- There are no dollar changes to the Strong Workforce Program; however, the May Revision proposes several changes including a 60%/40% (college/region) split of funding allocated to regions and allowing up to 60% of the funding received by the college to be used for ongoing purposes.
