TALCAS

The new TALCAS Project Director is Dean David Zielinski. He and the TALCAS team are busy refocusing the goals and objectives of the grant. And they are also engaged in creating a STEM Tutorial Center in the new TALCAS modular building. Other projects include: expanding the Test Proctoring Center, enhancing online tutoring, and developing a strong Canvas training program as we move closer to replacing Blackboard.

Force Option Training Simulator (FOTS)

- The FOTS is strongly recommended for POST Academies. The simulations expand skills and decision-making as multiple options are given to use or not use various types of force
- Law enforcement agencies want to hire those with FOTS training, which makes IVC students more competitive in the market
- Shooting recertification is required every 2 years. Local agencies will no longer have to travel out of county and IVC will have a revenue stream to offset maintenance costs.

Food and Housing Insecurity

There is a growing awareness across higher education of the challenges many of our students face in securing the basic necessities of food and housing. The Chancellor's Office has initiated a survey of our colleges to develop baseline data on the prevalence of homelessness and food insecurity, as well as the strategies that our colleges have deployed to assist students struggling with these challenges.

Closure of ITT

In late August, the U.S. Department of Education (USDOE) took action against the parent company of ITT Technical Institutes to block the private technical college from enrolling additional students receiving federal aid. As many as 35,000 students at ITT campuses across the U.S. are impacted. Many community colleges are being pulled in to support ITT students who are being left in a vulnerable position through no fault of their own.

Common Assessment Initiative Implementation

Development of the new assessment, CCCAssess, is taking longer than anticipated and, as a result, its scheduled implementation at about 40 pilot colleges in November will be delayed. There are a number of test items within the assessment that still need more validation with specific populations before they can be utilized for placement purposes.

Fresh Success

The Foundation for California Community Colleges has been awarded a contract from the California Department of Social Services to assist in the implementation of campus-based pilot programs associated with CalFresh to help participants gain job skills and find employment. Two pilot sites have been identified: Gavilan College and Cosumnes River College. It is anticipated that the program could grow to include additional community colleges and community-based organizations over time.
