Student Services participated in the City of El Centro Homenaje a Los Muertos Event, which was held at the Old Post Office in El Centro on October 27, 2017.



















STATE UPDATE: HIGHER ED 2017 BILLS SIGNED/VETOED

- AB 17 (Holden) Subsidized Student Transit Plan. Would have created a program to subsidize student transit passes. Status: Vetoed
- AB 19 (Santiago) California College Promise Program. Contingent on a funding appropriation, a district may waive fees for all full-time students in their first academic year, regardless of financial need. Status: Signed
- AB 21 (Kalra) Equitable Access to Higher Education. Sets statewide policies and guidelines on how colleges and universities can interact with federal immigration officials. Status: Signed
- AB 343 (McCarty) Refugees Eligibility for In-State, Tuition and Financial Aid. Will permit refugees and their dependents who have been forced to immigrate to this country due to their service to the armed forces of the United States to qualify for in state tuition and California Promise College Grants. Status: Signed
- AB 568 (Gonzalez Fletcher) Maternity Leave. Would have required at least six weeks of a leave of absence with full pay for a certificated, academic, or classified employee who is required to be absent from duties because of pregnancy, miscarriage, childbirth, and recovery therefrom. Status: Vetoed
- AB 705 (Irwin) Matriculation: Assessment. Requires districts to maximize the probability that
 a student will enter and complete coursework in math and English within a one-year timeframe by utilizing multiple measures. Status: Signed
- AB 1651 (Reyes) Paid Administrative Leave. Requires colleges to provide the general reason why an employee has been placed on administrative leave. Status: Signed
- SB 68 (Lara) AB 540 Extension: Expands eligibility for exemption from paying nonresident tuition to students who have completed three or more years of attendance or earned credits equivalent to three or more years of full-time credits at elementary school, secondary school, adult school and/or community college. Status: Signed
- SB 169 (Jackson) Education: Sex Equity. SB 169 would have required higher education institutions to adopt rules for the prevention of sexual violence, and adopt grievance and investigation procedures to resolve complaints of sexual violence. Status: Vetoed
