If you cannot volunteer on the day that your department/program signs up, you can request to volunteer any other day.



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STATE UPDATE

Immigration Policy: In the wake of the Trump Administration's Executive Order on Immigration, Chancellor Eloy Ortiz Oakley has reiterated the Board of Governors' commitment to support the values that our college system represents. His office continues to monitor the situation and will activate the Rapid Response Task Force if threats to our system warrant it.

Guided Pathways: The Governor's \$150 million Guided Pathways budget proposal will provide one-time grants to colleges to integrate recent investments and redesign academic pathways in a way that promotes better course taking decisions and increase the number of students who earn a certificate or degree. The full details on the state program will be known in late June when the state budget has been finalized.

Integration of SSSP, Student Equity, and Basic Skills: Later this month, the Chancellor's Office will roll out a new integrated model for the Student Success and Support Program, Student Equity Program, and Basic Skills Initiative. Under the redesigned program model, colleges will complete a single plan instead of three separate plans.
