





- IVC has received an additional \$500,000 in student success completion grant funding.




STATE UPDATE: BUDGET PROPOSAL

The governor has made four notable expenditures in the 2019-20 budget:

- A second year of free tuition to first-time full-time students and other local College Promise strategies;
- Increased award amounts and expansion of Cal Grant programs;
- A buy-down of K-14 PERS and STRS rate increases; and
- Ongoing increases to funding formula rates.

The proposal includes a cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) of 3.46% and resources to support formula rate increases. Flexible resources are critical as they enable colleges to address increased operating costs and offer quality programs to all students.


