ACADEMIC SERVICES - IVC DUAL ENROLLMENT UPDATE

- Eliminated Paper Application.
- Added Calexico High School as a Dual Enrollment School.
- Fall 2019 Application: 289 vs. Fall 2020 Applications: 522. A 55% increase in student enrollments.
- Offering 13 Asynchronous courses.
- New enrollment model allowing students from other schools to enroll in courses outside of their district resulting in more student interest and participation.
 - Expanded student follow-up, stress management, mental health counseling, and tutoring services.
 - Recruitment for Spring 2020 begins November 2020.

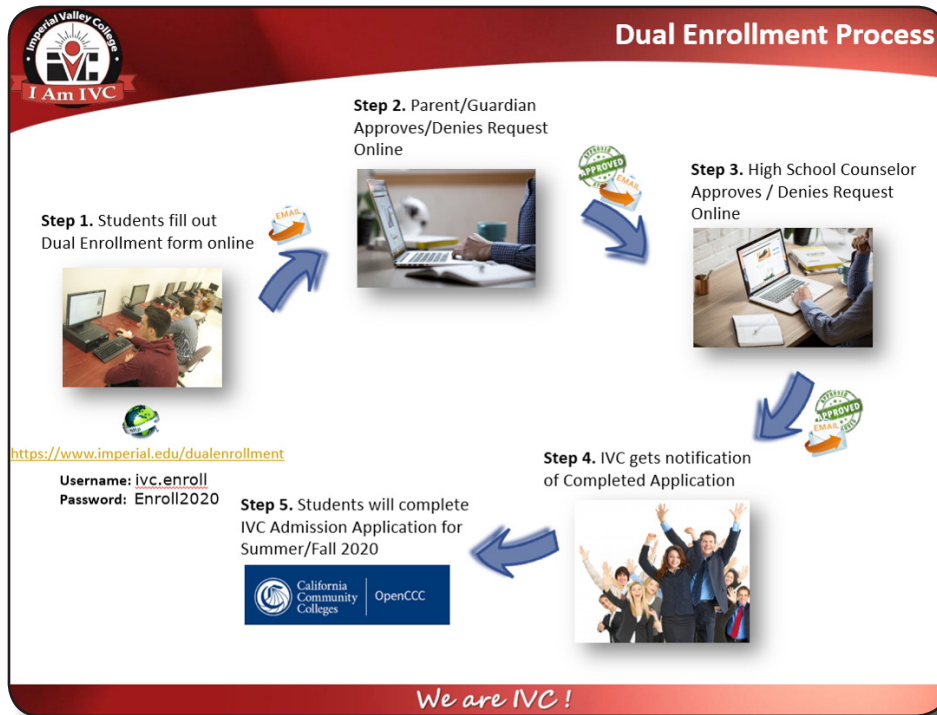

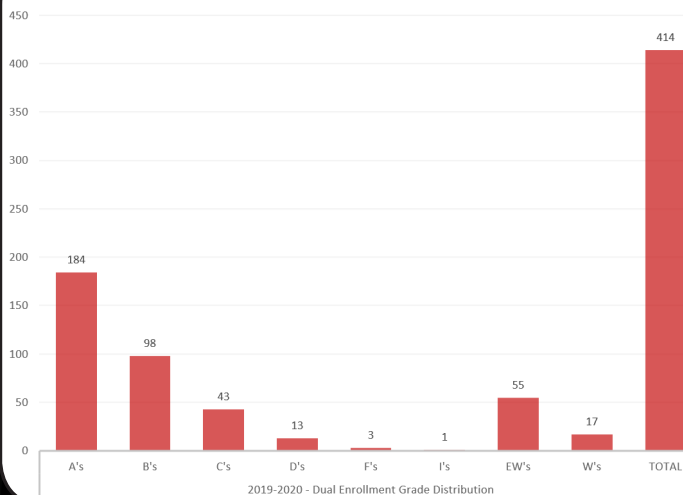

- New WBL Coordinator – Irene Drye
- New Work Plan focuses on Faculty Professional Development.
- Professional Development Opportunities in November, December, February and March.
- WBL Kickoff Meeting will take place on October 27, 2020. Invited ALL Faculty (39 Registrants).

What is Applied and Work-Based Learning?

Work-Based Learning provides students with the opportunity to connect what they are learning in the classroom to real world experiences.

WBL encourages students to learn about work with career awareness and exploration, learn through work with practicum and internships, and learn for work with training and experiences directly related to a specific career field.

Faculty play a critical role in ensuring these experiences are embedded into curriculum and support learning. The Work-Based Learning program supports faculty to enrich their curriculum and deepen classroom learning by embedding real world educational experiences and applicable 21st Century Skills to prepare students for today's career opportunities.

ACADEMIC SERVICES

Student Learning Outcomes Update (SLOs, PLOs, SAOs, ILOs)

- SLO collected for the Spring 20 Semester: Courses 115, SLOS 147.
- SLO Planned for the Fall 20 Semester: 306 SLOs scheduled to be assessed.
- PLOs and Alignment Maps to be assessed Fall 20 Semester: 26 Programs to be assessed.
- 56 SAOs to be assessed. SAOSs are assessed every fall semester. 37 departments will participate.
- Instructional Learning Outcomes (ILOs) Survey conducted by the Outcomes and Assessment Committee in Spring 2020.
 - Survey sent to nearly 1,200 graduating students in Spring 2020.
 - 242 students completed the survey.
 - This is the third year that the ILO Survey has been used.
 - Outcomes and Assessment Committee will review survey data from all three ILOs at next scheduled meeting.

STATE UPDATE

- **AB 70 (Berman) - Conversion of For-Profit Institutions to Non-Profits** - Creates a series of guidelines and regulations for the Attorney General to follow when approving a conversion of a for-profit college into either a non-profit institution or a public entity.
Status: Signed into Law
- **AB 2288 (Low) Nursing Programs** - Will provide more flexibility for nursing programs facing a reduction in clinical training hours due to the COVID-19 crisis. **Status: Signed into Law**
 - **AB 2416 (Gabriel)** – Satisfactory Academic Progress will require colleges to consider homelessness as a mitigating factor when considering appeals for students who fail to maintain satisfactory academic progress. **Status: Signed into Law**

STATE UPDATE, Continued

- **AB 2884 (Berman) Lottery Dollars** - Will permit lottery dollars to be spent on student basic needs such as food and housing assistance. **Status: Signed into Law**
- **AB 3137 (Voepel) Armed Forces and California Promise** - Ensures that if a California Promise recipient is called up for active duty in the US armed forces that they will be able to re-enroll into the program without any penalty. **Status: Signed into Law**
- **SB 1232 (Glazer) CalWORKs** - Will permit CalWORKs recipients at public universities to receive a \$500 per semester benefit to pay for books and permit them to request reimbursement for classroom-related expenses above the allocated \$500. Implementation of the bill is contingent on an appropriation via the state budget, which did not occur for 2020-21. **Status: Signed into Law**
- **AB 493 (Jackson) Sexual Violence and Harassment**

Requires postsecondary institutions to create a series of policies and procedures relating to sexual harassment and violence amongst students.

Creates more stringent Title IX policy and procedures than is required by federal law. Among the policies and procedures that colleges will be required to adopt:

- Requires colleges to utilize a preponderance of evidence standard when adjudicating cases. Prohibition of cross-examination of either party by either parties' advisor.
- Regardless if a grievance relating to sexual harassment or violence is filed, if a college reasonably knows that an incident might have occurred, they will be required to investigate it.
- Ensure trauma-informed and impartial investigative procedures.

Status: Signed into Law
